

## 2005-2006 RUSHFORD ALUMNI ASSOCIATION NEWSLETTER

Many items for the newsletter are taken from the notes some of you write when you make your banquet reservations or when you send a donation. If you are planning a class reunion and you need some addresses for some of your classmates, or you just want to locate and renew acquaintance with another alumnus, I might be able to help. If you do have a class get-together, please let me some information about it for the newsletter such as who attended.

Thanks to Susan Clark Holmes ('66), Eva Smith Alderman ('42), Francis Owens Gilbert ('45), Audean Haskins ('65), Peggy Metcalf Armstrong ('76), and Audrey Pomeroy Wolfer ('78) and her daughter Lacey for helping stuff envelopes for the mailing that was done in 2005. Nearly 800 pieces of mail were put together and sent. The total number of responses from you in the form of banquet reservations and/or dues and/or scholarship donations between July 2005 and May 2006 was around 225.

Nearly 170 people attended the 2005 banquet. Decorations and table settings were arranged by Peggy Metcalf Armstrong ('76) and her mother Ruth Smith Metcalf ('56) with help from Audean Haskins ('65) and Lynette Covert Owens ('65). Susan Clark Holmes ('66) organized refreshments for the social hour. Art McElheny ('58) gave the invocation. A buffet dinner was put on and supervised by Kevin ('74) and Dawn ('77) Taylor. At the end of the banquet, music was provided by Cuba-Rushford Central School faculty member Aron Cole and his band. Of the classes honored (those whose graduation years ended with a "5" or a "0"), the Class of 1965 had the most members present. Alumni came from as far away as Florida, Arizona, and California. The oldest alumnus attending the banquet was **Vivian Gordon Marsh ('28)** of Williamsville, NY. Vivian, who grew up on her parent's fruit farm on Brookside Road, is also our oldest living alumnus. Ron Beverly ('65) was formally welcomed into the RCS alumni family, just as Patty Flynn Engh and her brother, Mick Flynn, were welcomed last year. (People who attended but did not graduate from RCS are always welcome as well as any Cuba-Rushford Central School graduate who attended elementary school at the Rushford campus.) Two people received remembrance at the banquet: **Francis Crowell ('41)** of Lowville, NY who provided for a \$2,000 gift to the Association in his will, and **Homer Norton** who taught high school English at RCS for 20 years beginning in 1952 and who later became Town of Rushford historian. The honoree of the evening was **Lois Buttifant Bruce ('46)** who has been maintaining alumni names and addresses on computer and been generating all the paper comprising the mailings in recent years. The latter included a newsletter that has been a real "shot in the arm" to the life of the Association. Corrie Worthington, a 2005 Cuba-Rushford Central School graduate, received our Albrow Scholarship award (presently \$500); she had enrolled in college at SUNY Alfred. This was the fifth consecutive scholarship given by the Association which has awarded almost \$4,000 since 2001. Francis Owens Gilbert ('45) and Audean Haskins ('65) presented the 2006 slate of officers with Peggy Metcalf Armstrong ('76) replacing Jim Pomeroy ('60) as President, Susan Clark Holmes ('66) replacing Peggy as Vice President, Orpha Clark Brooks ('62) replacing Susan as Secretary, and Audrey Pomeroy Wolfer ('78) remaining as Treasurer. Over \$200 was contributed to the scholarship fund by the Class of 1958 in memory of classmate Faye Webster Bliss. Our Treasurer has been able to restart a checking account for the Association without incurring minimum balance penalties. Here is a breakdown on the financial status of the Association: as of September 15, 2005 the Association had \$3,405 in its scholarship fund and \$3,830.29 in the general fund.
